

Consider This – Scrum

For this activity, I searched for an openly licensed image to help describe the origin and intent of Scrum, a methodology for Systems Development. The definition of “scrum” is “a rugby formation in which opposing forwards huddle and struggle for possession of the ball”

(<https://www.thefreedictionary.com/scrum>). Viewing the Scrum Foundations eLearning Series (<https://www.scrumalliance.org/learn-about-scrum/scrum-elearning-series>), we quickly learn that one of the Scrum roles is the Scrum Master.

Using the keywords “scrum master” and “agile”, I found the Creative Commons (CC) Search easiest to use. CC Search provided a link to the image’s website and it was easy to credit the creator of the image. The use of logical operators in CC Search made the search easier to find the most appropriate images. The “Filter Results By” checkboxes (e.g., “License CC BY”) of the CC Search helped me narrow down which image I can potentially use.

I decided to use the image where one of the players had a possession of the ball. This image can help explain that Scrum is a team activity and all members must help each other to achieve success in their systems development effort.
