The information is supported by evidence on how learners learn a language. There are several articles in the 'Publications' section of the Duolingo website. The resource is constantly being reviewed by users as they create the questions and can 'report' if a question or answer is incorrect or has errors. Spelling, grammar, or typographical errors are uncommon, though they sometimes occur. This is usually corrected through regular updates to the ap.

The information is fact, though some may be opinion, weeded out through users feedback. I do not believe Duolingo is used as propaganda, I do not believe there are intentional biases. Duolingo strives to make the learning environment inclusive and inviting to anyone who wants to learn a language.


#### Duolingo

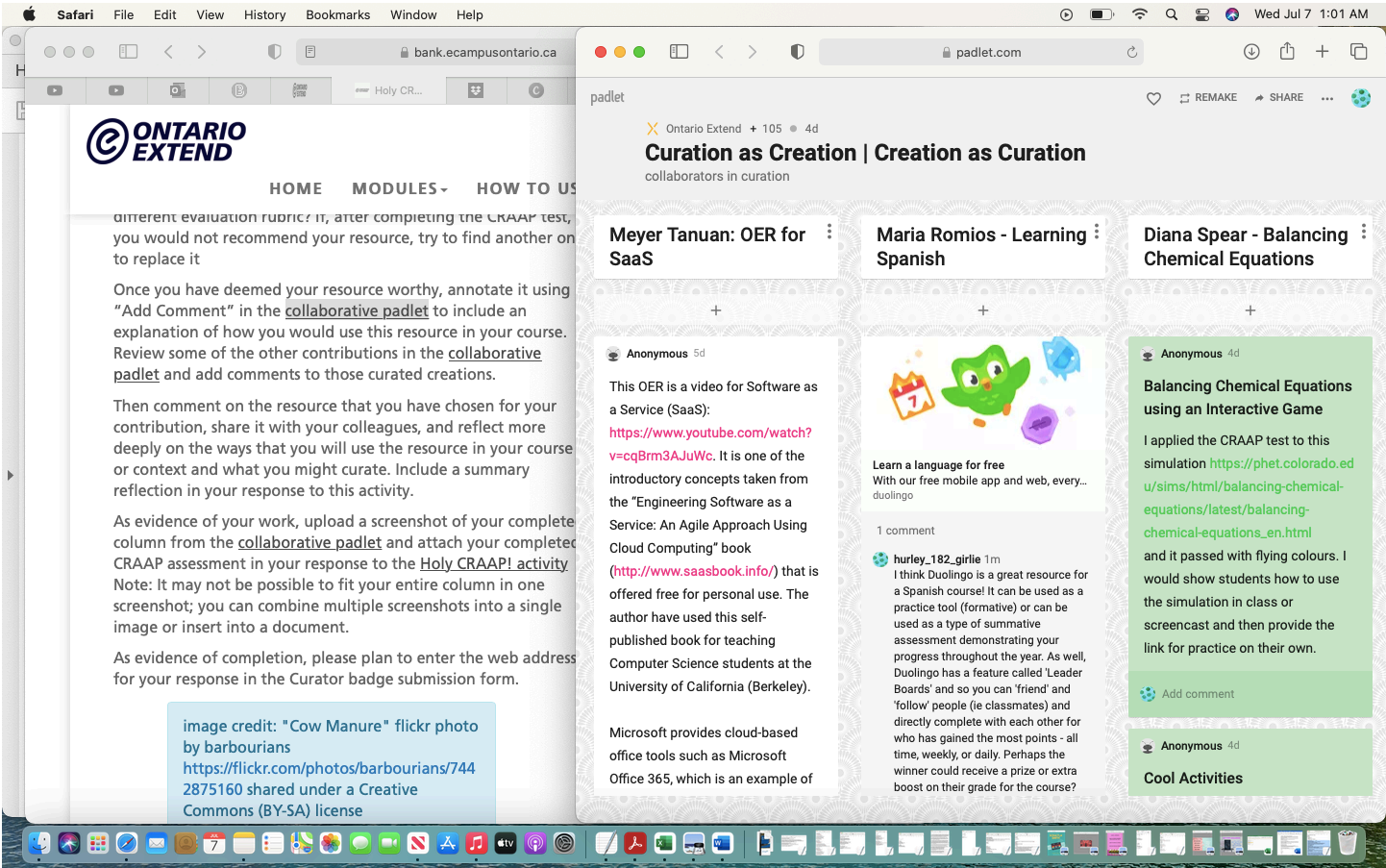
