Learner Challenge: A few of my students struggle with developing concession or counterarguments when revising their 5-paragraph essays. They find it difficult to present
alternative viewpoints or acknowledge opposing arguments effectively within their writing.
This challenge inhibits their ability to critically engage with their topics and limits the depth
of their analysis. Addressing this issue can empower students to strengthen their
argumentative writing skills and foster a more nuanced understanding of complex issues.

Since I cannot have access to the Padlet, I am adding my response here:

Identify what technology you selected. I have used Coggle. Incorporating the steps for writing concessions using Coggle into our curriculum will simplify learning about concessions. Students will learn steps involved in developing concessions and apply the steps in their writing through structured lessons guided by teachers. They'll practice with assignments and group work, improving their writing and critical thinking skills. This approach caters to different learning styles, particularly benefiting visual learners who thrive with visual aids like Coggle.
